

1. INTRODUCTION

As we approach tryouts and the start of the 2024-25 North Allegheny Boys Soccer (NABS) season, the 56th year of this storied program, we wanted to pass along some important information to all parents of NABS prospects. Please read this information entirely before asking any questions.

Coach Manuel Montero enters his third season as Head Coach of NABS, following coaches Bruno Schwarz ('68-'04) and Bobby Vosmaer ('05-'21). With his extensive experience coaching soccer at the club, high school, and collegiate level, Coach Montero is focused first and foremost on the development of his players as athletes, competitors, and outstanding young men. As a U.S. Army veteran, Coach Montero's coaching style emphasizes the virtues of discipline, respect, and courage.

It is easy to see Coach Montero's vision for the future of the NABS program take shape. In only his second season as Head Coach, Coach Montero realized one of the best regular season records in program history with 14W, 1L, and 3T. In the post-season, Coach Montero took NABS to its first WPIAL AAAA Championship match since winning back-to-back WPIAL titles in 2016-17 and 2017-18, where NABS was edged out 2-1 by Norwin in the PK shootout that followed a 2OT stalemate. Despite the narrow defeat, the second-place WPIAL finish qualified NABS for the PIAA state tournament - its first appearance since 2017. Our state title run was ended in the PIAA quarterfinal match by Central Bucks South, a team that ultimately went on to play in a tightly contested PIAA Championship match against perennial PIAA state title contender Conestoga HS.

The NABS Boosters organization has played a central role in the operations of NABS for decades and has been a key partner in the program's success. The NABS Boosters is committed to help Coach Montero continue to build his vision for the future of the NABS program, and there are many opportunities for all to become involved in something that is sure to be one of your son's fondest memories of their time as a North Allegheny student-athlete.

We realize that the parents of NABS prospects especially those new to the program, are likely to have many questions. This document is intended to provide some general information regarding

the upcoming season and the expectations of program participants. We hope that this document will answer many of the questions you may have.

2. TRYOUTS

2.1 Tryout Location and Schedule

Tryouts for **all NABS teams** will be held at North Allegheny Intermediate:

North Allegheny Intermediate (NAI) 350 Cumberland Road Pittsburgh, PA 15237

Rising 10th, 11th, & 12th graders:

August 12, 13, 14 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM

Rising 9th Graders:

August 12, 13, 14 12:00 PM – 2:00 PM

Note: Only selected 9th graders will be invited to tryout with upperclassmen beginning August 13th. Invites will come directly from NABS coaching staff. Every 9th grader needs to report to 9th grade tryouts on Monday Aug. 12th @ 12:00 PM.

7th and 8th graders:

August 12, 13, 14 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM

IMPORTANT: All NABS prospects must attend all three tryout dates.

Please <u>plan to arrive at least 20 min</u> before the start of the scheduled tryout time as Coach Montero will get started promptly and <u>athletes are expected to warm up on their own</u>. NABS Booster representatives will help check kids in at tryouts and pass out pinnies.

All NABS prospects must bring the following to each day of tryouts:

- Soccer cleats
- Running shoes
- Shinguards
- Water
- Sunscreen

NABS coaches will be evaluating the technical, tactical, physical, and mental aspects of the game.

2.2 Tryout Format

Note: The Cooper and Beep tests will begin promptly at the beginning of the JV & Varsity tryout. If a player is late, they will not be able to run it and will not have a data point. The Cooper test will help us determine a prospect's current fitness level and speed. The Cooper test will determine the order in which kids that make a roster will select their jersey number. The lower their Cooper test time, the higher the pick they will earn.

3. ROSTERING

Roster decisions for all NABS teams will be strictly merit based and made with the overarching goal of maximizing player development across the five NABS teams. Your child's roster placement will give full consideration to their physical, technical, tactical, and mental abilities at the current stage of their development.

3.1 Rostering Philosophy

One key change implemented by Coach Montero for NABS is that athletes are not rostered strictly according to grade level. Player development is at the forefront of Coach Montero's philosophy. Therefore, placing your child in the appropriate development environment is key to defining their development trajectory. Rostering decisions must balance resistance and success. Too much resistance and it leads to frustration and low confidence. Too much success leads to bad habits, low effort, and ultimately an athlete not achieving their full potential. By finding the right balance of success and resistance for your son, we can maximize his unique development path. Keep in mind that every single child develops at different rates in all aspects (physical, technical, mental...) and the best players this season may not be the same as next season. This is especially true with athletes in grades 7-9, at which time most athletes are in the early stages of puberty. Your son will be placed on a team that matches his current stage of development, but that can change dramatically from one season to the next. Coach Montero's goal is to define a development

trajectory for each child that maximizes their chances of playing Varsity soccer in an extremely competitive WPIAL 4A boys soccer program. This will in turn make our Varsity team stronger in coming years: <u>a rising tide lifts all boats</u>.

Team names will be as follows: Varsity, JV, Black, Gold, and White

3.2 Roster Notification

Roster decisions will be made by the end of the last day of tryouts and are at the discretion of NABS coaches. Varsity and Junior Varsity rosters will be posted on the NA Athletics website on the evening of Aug. 14 so that the rostered athletes have the opportunity to prepare for practice and team building activities scheduled for Thursday, August 15th. The NABS coaching staff will talk to players individually during Wednesday's session to let them know their roster status. Players who are cut will be given the reason for the decision and also advice on how they can prepare for next year's tryouts to make the team.

Official Black, Gold, and White team roster decisions will be announced via the NA Athletics website. Although the coaches will typically inform the athletes of roster decisions on the field following the final tryout, the rostering is not official until the NA Athletics office has certified that your child has met all participation requirements. There may also be late roster additions/changes should any athlete decline their roster offer.

3.2 Accepting/Declining Roster Offer

Roster offers will be assumed to be implicitly accepted. Prospects can decline the offer to play above grade level or decline the roster spot they are offered. Above all, we want players to be excited by this opportunity and have fun. If your child decides not to accept their roster spot, it will not count against them for future participation in NABS. However, it is true that athletes that remain in the program will have an advantage making the team in subsequent seasons because they will be more familiar with our style of play, our culture, and our training methods, and most importantly our coaches will gain a much better sense of each athlete's abilities, training habits, attitude, and mentality from a season's worth of observation. This carries more weight than what we can glean from a single tryout. Jumping back in the program will place more pressure for your child to perform during tryouts as we can only evaluate what we see across three days. If your child is declining their roster offer, Coach Manuel needs to know immediately as it will free up a roster spot for someone else.

3.3. Communications Platform

North Allegheny Athletics requires the use of the SportsYou app for all team communications and scheduling. Details on using the SportsYou app will be circulated upon roster acceptance.

4. LEADERSHIP CAMP AND TEAM PICNIC

Note: These events are limited to JUNIOR VARSITY and VARSITY rostered athletes only.

All players accepting JV and Varsity roster spots will be expected to attend the NABS Leadership Camp held at <u>Camp Guyasuta</u> on Friday, August 16 from 2:00 – 6:00 PM. The camp is an opportunity for players to get to know their teammates and coaches better and also begin to form the bonds that are crucial to success on the field. That evening, NABS Boosters will be sponsoring a team picnic at Blueberry Hill Park, Franklin Park Township, from 7:00 - 9:00 PM for all JV and Varsity rostered players.

Transportation will be provided from Blueberry Hill Park to Camp Guyasuta. Athletes are expected to arrive at Blueberry Hill Park by 11:00 AM (lower field, see map) for a team meeting and team bonding activities. The bus for Camp Guyasuta will leave from Blueberry Hill Park at 1:15 PM, and will return to Blueberry Hill Park in time for the picnic. Athletes leaving their cars for Camp Guyasuta will need to park next to the pickleball courts (see map, "Park Here").



To simplify payment, the cost of the camp has been integrated into the JV/V booster dues instead of requiring a separate camp payment as has been done in past years.

In addition to the activities on Friday, August 16th, any JV/Varsity rostered players are expected to attend the following activities on Thursday, August 15th (All Activities at NASH):

- JV/Varsity Uniform Distribution at 1 3 PM
- JV/Varsity Photos at 3 4 PM
- JV/Varsity Practice at 4 6 PM
- Team Meetings/Bonding Activities at 6 8 PM

• Note – NABS Boosters will provide pizza and drinks for players after practice.

5. NABS BOOSTERS ORGANIZATION

5.1 Boosters Activities and Benefits

If your son has participated in the NABS program in previous seasons, you are already acquainted with the NABS Boosters organization and understand how much it does to support the NABS program both operationally and financially. For those new to the program, NABS Boosters organizes and/or subsidizes events throughout the season that includes: the Leadership Camp, Pre-Season Picnic, Senior Night, Pack the Pitch/SoccerFest, team dinners, middle school pizza parties, team photos, Middle School Recognition Night, and the NABS Banquet at the end of the season. The NABS boosters also subsidizes the costs of some field/training equipment, match video recordings, uniform articles, and an additional coaching stipend. The NABS Boosters is responsible for organizing fundraising activities that augment Booster dues, such as manning the concession stand for NA athletic events.

NABS Boosters is a tax-exempt 501c(3) registered entity.

5.2 Booster Dues

The NABS Booster dues schedule for the 2024-25 season is as follows:

Junior Varsity/Varsity Team: \$250/season

Black, Gold & White Teams: \$125/season

The Booster dues schedule corresponds to the team your child is rostered on. Instances where a 9th grader is rostered on Junior Varsity or Varsity teams, the JV/Varsity dues apply.

Booster dues are a participation requirement and must be paid in full upon roster acceptance and prior to uniform distribution (see below). The NABS Booster dues schedule is comparable to other NA team sports and is intended to place less emphasis on fundraising initiatives that depend largely on the participation and the finances of the parents of NABS athletes. Your child will not be issued a uniform until dues and a uniform deposit have been collected.

In the event that extreme financial hardship or extenuating family circumstances would prevent an athlete's participation in NABS, a parent or guardian of the athlete is encouraged to contact NABS boosters President Mike Eck at 724-612-7422 or eckmike@hotmail.com to discuss potentially reducing or waiving booster dues. This discussion will be kept in complete confidence.

Booster dues may be remitted in one of two ways:

- 2.) By personal check payable to NABS Boosters.

If paying by check, please be prepared on Aug. 15th with <u>separate checks</u> for the required Booster dues and uniform deposit for the team your son is rostered on. We do not cash the uniform deposit check upon receipt.

Payments must be received **before uniforms are distributed**. For JV and Varsity athletes, that will be **during practice on Thursday**, **August 15**th **from 1 - 3 PM**. Athletes will need them for team photos taken that afternoon between **3 - 4 PM** and also our first pre-season match on Saturday Aug. 17th. White, Gold, and Black team uniforms will be distributed during the week of Aug. 19th. See section 6.5 below for more details.

5.3 Booster Organization Obligations

Every family of a rostered NABS athlete belongs to and is a beneficiary of the NABS Boosters Association. NABS could not function without the operational and financial support of the Boosters, and the NABS Boosters could not function without the volunteer efforts of NABS families. We hope that all will recognize the importance of the NABS Boosters and the support they provide to the athletes, coaches, and the NABS program as a whole. We also hope that this will encourage all families to volunteer a little of their time to help with the many NABS Booster functions. Volunteering to assist the Boosters is a great way to get to know other NABS parents, many of whom you will become more familiar and friendly as your child progresses through the program. Being active in the NABS Boosters ensures that parents have an opportunity for some fun along with their sons! Volunteering in any capacity is greatly appreciated and strongly encouraged.

In addition to many optional NABS Boosters volunteer roles, each family will maintain two mandatory obligations to the NABS Boosters: (1) remitting NABS Booster dues & unform deposit, and (2) staffing the concession stand. Staffing the concession stand at NABS matches and NA football games provides as much financial support for the NABS program as the sum of all Booster dues collected. Together, these two principal income sources support most of the NABS program budget. Every family of an NABS athlete(s) is required to work at least two concession stand shifts during the season, regardless of your son's grade level or the number of children you have in the NABS program. This has long been a program obligation,

and it represents a commitment of only a few hours of service to the organization over an entire season. Compliance with this obligation has not required aggressive enforcement, but over the past few seasons it became clear that fewer families were taking this obligation seriously. This has unfairly burdened those willing to volunteer. If NABS Boosters declined to share in concessions operations, we would have to double our program dues or curtail many enriching and fun activities for athletes and their families. Between regular season and post-season soccer and football matches, there are ample opportunities for families to meet its concession stand obligation. It can be fun and is also a great opportunity to get to know others if you are a newcomer!

When an athlete is issued their uniform, a deposit is required to ensure that uniforms are returned in good condition. This deposit also serves as collateral to ensure compliance with the concession stand staffing requirement (see section 6.4 below).

6. UNIFORMS

6.1 Requirements

Some of the uniform articles are the property of the NA school district and NABS Boosters and are issued to the players for the duration of the season. These are the match kits, warm-up pants, and the waterproof cold-weather parka. Last season, all middle school teams received new match kits with a consistent style. This season, Varsity and JV teams will be issued new match kits. These articles are the property of the NA School District (NASD) and must be returned at the end of the season.

Some additional uniform articles are a program requirement. These additional uniform articles (see below) are purchased by the athletes upon roster acceptance and are theirs to use and keep. These items do not need to be purchased every season. The expectation is that athletes will purchase these articles once and use them until they graduate, are outgrown, lost, or become otherwise unwearable. The exception is those athletes transitioning from MS rosters to JV/Varsity rosters, will be required to purchase the training hoodie and backpack. Athletes new to the program, which will primarily be rising 7th graders, will need to purchase the complete training kit required for their roster level (either MS or V/JV teams). The uniform requirements differ for middle school and Varsity/JV teams, but the styles are continuous across all five NABS teams. Athletes who need a larger size or to replace a missing item can purchase only the items they need. The NABS Boosters is assisting Coach Montero and NA Athletics with the ordering and distribution of these additional uniform articles, including collecting funds to reimburse the Athletics department for their purchase.

In addition, each player in the NABS program will receive a senior-designed Dri-fit T-shirt sponsored by the NABS Boosters at no cost. This is a NABS tradition, and the senior-designed T-shirt can be worn to school, workouts, out on the town, etc. to promote awareness and excitement for the upcoming season.

6.2 Junior Varsity and Varsity Uniform Package

The 2024-25 uniform package for Junior Varsity and Varsity rostered athletes is:

Home Match Kit (Black) - Must be returned at end of season
Away Match Kit (White) - Must be returned at end of season
Pre-match jerseys (Yellow) - Must be returned at end of season
Home Socks (Black) - Do not need to be returned
Away Socks (White) - Do not need to be returned
Waterproof Bench Parka - Must be returned at end of season
Warm-up pants - Must be returned at end of season

Additional JV/V Required Uniform Articles:

Black Nike Classic II Practice short:	\$25
Grey Nike Tiempo II Practice jersey:	\$30

Many athletes last season wanted to wear their team-issued parka to non-NABS events, and some expressed interest in purchasing them. To limit wear and loss to the on-loan uniform articles, we ask that athletes reserve their use for NABS events. Several parkas were not returned or returned damaged after last season and had to be re-ordered. This year we will be offering the exact same parka in the NABS Spiritwear shop for \$130 (see section 8 below). Athletes may decline the team-issued parka and order their own parka to keep and use as they wish.

6.3 Black, Gold & White Team Uniform Package

The 2024-25 uniform package for Black, Gold & White rostered athletes is:

Basic Uniform Articles:

Home Match Kit (Black) - Must be returned at end of season Away Match Kit (White) – Must be returned at end of season Home Socks (Black) - Do not need to be returned Away Socks (White) – Do not need to be returned

Additional Middle School Required Uniform Articles:

Black Nike Tiempo II Practice jersey: \$30
Black Nike Classic II Practice short: \$25

Grey Nike Tiempo II Practice jersey: \$30 Grey Nike Classic II Practice short: \$25

The NABS Boosters will have a sufficient stock of these articles to meet the expected roster needs this season. We will distribute them and collect payments at a time TBD. Details will be circulated to athletes after roster acceptance. If you did not respond to the call during the summer to request replacement articles for your son, there may be some surplus items available after the distribution is complete. However, we cannot guarantee that we will have surplus stock in the required size.

6.4 Uniform Deposit/Collateral

In addition to Booster Dues, collateral of \$250 for JV/Varsity rostered players and \$150 for Black, Gold White rostered players is required to:

- 1. Reimburse NASD for any lost or damaged uniform articles. The uniforms are the property of NASD and the NABS Boosters association assumes responsibility for their return to NASD at the end of season. The loaned uniform package costs approximately \$500 per player and we have had too many loaned uniform articles go missing over the last two seasons. For this reason, the uniform collateral has been raised as the former \$100 collateral amount was not sufficient to replace the lost articles.
- 2. Ensure that all NABS families fulfill their obligation to staff the concession stand.

The uniform deposit/collateral MUST be furnished when uniforms are distributed with a personal check made out to NABS Boosters with "Uniform Deposit" in the memo line. Uniforms will not be distributed to a player without receipt of the deposit check. This check will be held by the NABS Boosters treasurer in a safe location and will be returned or destroyed at the end of season once it is verified that the uniform has been returned and the family has met its concession stand obligation. Other uniform articles are the property of the athlete and do not need to be returned at the end of the season.

6.5 Uniform Distribution Procedure

JV and Varsity Uniforms will be distributed at NASH on **Thursday August 15**th from 1 - 3 PM. Black, Gold, and White team uniforms will be distributed the week of August 19 after practice.

Team uniforms are the property of the NA School District and the NABS Boosters assumes responsibility for issuing and collecting team uniforms at the end of the season. Uniforms will not be distributed to your child until payments have been received. Please see the checklist at the end of this document.

JV and Varsity players will be able to select from the available jersey numbers in their preferred size based on a prioritization scheme at the discretion of Coach Montero. Black, Gold and White Team uniforms will be distributed to optimize fit across the team. Number selection will be the same as for JV and Varsity, with Cooper test times determining the order in which players select

their jersey numbers from the size assigned to them. Note that a players first choice jersey number may not be available in their ideal size. Practice kits, sweatshirts, and parkas are not numbered as a player's jersey number may not be the same from season to season.

7. LOCKER ROOM

The expansive NABS locker room is an important resource that would be the envy of some collegiate soccer programs! Each JV and Varsity athlete will be assigned a locker with a personalized nameplate that is theirs to use exclusively throughout the season. Athletes should bring a combination lock to secure their belongings. The NABS locker room will also be used for video analysis sessions, pre-match preparation, and most importantly a post-match recovery program that Coach Montero is implementing with the assistance of NA athletic trainers.

8. NABS SPIRITWEAR SALE

The NABS Boosters hosts an annual Spiritwear sale. All sales will be transacted at our online NABS Spiritwear Store:

The website is now live and ready to take orders and will remain open until Sunday August 25 at midnight. We expect items to be delivered the week of September 16. Your team parent will distribute the merchandise at practice once it all arrives, so please be on the lookout for that notification. A portion of the proceeds benefits NABS Boosters, so you are supporting both your child's NABS team and the NABS Boosters by shopping our Spiritwear sale.

9. PARENT MEETING

There will be a parent meeting on Weds, August 14 at 8 PM in the Ponce Room of the Baierl Center. Parents of rostered NABS athletes are strongly encouraged to attend.

10. NABS BOOSTERS OFFICERS AND VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

The NABS Booster board comprises a President, Co-Treasurers, Concessions Coordinator, and a Special Events Coordinator(s). The current NABS Booster leadership volunteered at the end of the previous season, and this small group of officers has been working hard all summer long to prepare for the upcoming season.

Once rosters are announced, it is critical that additional volunteers are confirmed to assist with the various duties required of the Soccer Boosters. If you are interested or willing to volunteer, please contact Mike Eck at 724-612-7422 or eckmike@hotmail.com

All athletes should be dressed in **their black match kits**, **including socks**. There may be additional requirements for seniors - these will be communicated directly to them.

PRE-SEASON CHECKLIST

1. Attend tryouts. Note that prospects that did not complete NASD pre-participation requirements will not be able to try out. Please refer to section 2.1 for tryout dates and times. Prospects must attend all three days of tryouts.

2. Look out for roster announcements

Junior Varsity and Varsity Prospects: Monitor the <u>NA Athletics website</u> on Wednesday, Aug. 14th for roster announcements. The NA Athletics department must certify the eligibility of all rostered athletes before official rosters can be released.

Black, Gold, and White Team Prospects: Roster announcements are made on-field following the last day of tryouts. The NA Athletics department must certify the eligibility of all rostered athletes before official rosters can be released.

- **3.** Accept roster offer. Acceptance of a roster offer is implicit unless Coach Montero is notified that your child is declining. Please let Coach Montero know ASAP if you are declining.
- **4. Pay Booster Dues.** Payment of booster dues is required upon roster acceptance. Dues should be remitted by PayPal (preferred) or alternatively by personal check. Dues are \$250 for Junior Varsity and Varsity athletes, and \$125 for middle school (White, Black, Gold) rosters.

5. Collect Uniforms!

Junior Varsity and Varsity Prospects: Uniforms will be distributed on Thursday, Aug 15th from 1:00 - 3:00 PM at Newman Stadium prior to team photos. Each athlete should be prepared with the following:

- A \$250 check payable to NABS Boosters for your annual dues if you did not pay using PayPal
- A \$250 check payable to NABS Boosters for the uniform deposit/collateral (will not be cashed). Please do not remit this deposit using PayPal.
